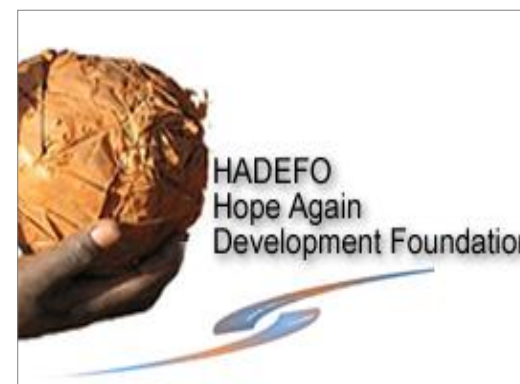

Climate Change Project

Thanks to a cooperation agreement with Rotary Club Ngora, HADEO received from Roofing Industries, 5.000 seedlings of avocado, mango and jackfruit, worth 2.000 dollars. After a short training, these were distributed in April, to members of the group in Kapir. Through Rotary Club Kampala, seedlings will soon be distributed to several schools.

Dignity for Girls project

At the 10 schools where Fiona en Flavia completed in April the Sexual Awareness Project, HADEO will train girls to make soap and reusable

sanitary pads. With the aim of keeping girls at school. They also will track down pregnant girls who have left school and motivate them to return. They will also receive training. For the older drop-outs, this skills could be the step to earn an income. The project was launched on February 17, during a meeting with stakeholders. Money for the rehabilitation of pregnant drop-outs has been promised by former Museumtechnische Werken. For the training of 1500 girls an amount of 22.500 euros is needed. Of this, 9.000 has been collected, thanks to donations from Deelcafé de Buurvrouw from Winsum, our supporters and an amount of 4.000 euros from the Anton Jurgens Fund.

Sheep for Angod A

The members of Angod A will receive training in May, after which in June the sheep will be distributed in a festive manner. A total of **3091 euros** has been collected. Our female runners have run together for 26 sheep. One sheep was donate by the second-hand clothed market "Ons

pakkie-an" from Winsum. Our donors gave 35 sheep. The money is also spend on training and the transportation of the sheep.

HADEO Activities

Hard work is being done to strenghten the Farmers Credit' Bank. Alle groups are visited and trained and motivating members to repay their loans. If results are good, loans will be issued again in June. The HADEO team is actively focused on cooperation with various organizations. Agreements have been signed with the Rotary club Ngora and the cultural association of TESO, ICUDEF. HADEO has become part of SOCADIDO, which receive funds of the German Federal Government. Work is being done on a partnership of development partners in TESO, who receive funds to develop the region. James Odongo and Vincent Okello have completed the training and since May 8, HADEO has been part of this platform.
